Assistant/Associate Professor of Mathematics Education Moscow, Idaho campus

We are seeking applicants for a full-time, educator and researcher who will be a leader in mathematics education beginning August 15, 2012. The successful candidate will have an earned doctorate in mathematics education or related field and will continue an active research program that includes dissemination and publication of research, seeking external funding, and mentoring graduate students. The successful candidate will also teach undergraduate and graduate education courses, develop and maintain collaborative partnerships with professionals in schools and with state policy makers as well as serve on state, regional and university committees; and participate in professional development and outreach programs for P-12 teachers.

Associate/Full Professor and Director of Teacher Education Moscow, Idaho Campus

We are seeking applicants with an earned doctorate in education for a full-time, tenured appointment as Director of Teacher Education beginning August 2012. Applicant should be an experienced teacher educator and researcher of teacher education with at least three years of experience in K-12 schools. The successful candidate who serves in this newly created position will establish a research agenda and translate research into best practice, view the rugged and rural nature of Idaho as an opportunity to better understand rural education, and value diversity, collaboration and partnership in teacher preparation. The successful candidate will also be the overall administrator of the teacher education programs in Curriculum and Instruction, including elementary education and secondary education, and will coordinate communication, licensure and accreditation policies and practices for programs in other departments across the university.

Assistant Professor in Special Education - Tenure Track Moscow, Idaho Campus

We are seeking applicants for a full-time, tenure-track appointment in special education beginning August 2012. Review of Applications begins March 31, 2012 and will continue until the position is filled. The successful candidate will teach graduate courses in mild to moderate categories of disabilities, as well as college graduate research courses using distance learning and technologies, and advise graduate students to program completion. Successful candidate will also develop and maintain an active research agenda consistent with preparation, program direction, and a doctoral-extensive research institution; develop and maintain collaborative partnerships with professionals in schools and at the Center on Disabilities and Human Development; assist state and regional policy makers; provide professional development opportunities for teachers; serve on university, state, and regional committees.

Assistant or Associate Professor of Rehabilitation and Community Counseling - Tenure Track, Boise - Meridian, Idaho

We are seeking applicants for a full-time, tenure track appointment in rehabilitation and community counseling beginning mid-May 2012. Applicants will have an earned doctorate in rehabilitation counseling or related field with experience in rehabilitation counseling. CRC certification or eligibility and ability to provide transportation are required. The position's primary programmatic responsibility is three part: 1) build relationships with IDVR and related state and private agencies dedicated to or interested in providing rehabilitation counseling services and graduate degree programs in southeastern Idaho, especially in the Boise area; 2) identify and recruit graduate students into a Rehabilitation Counseling Master's degree program and help create Category R online certification courses; 3) deliver related courses and professional development events to state and private agencies during the 2012-2013 academic year in preparation for the degree and certification programs.
